Practical information

How to come to Grenoble?

By plane: 4 to 6 daily flights between Paris and Lyon, then shuttle to Grenoble

- Lyon-Saint-Exupéry Airport to Grenoble by bus takes around 1 hour. The first shuttle bus of the day leaves at 07:30 and the last at 23:30. There are 20 or so trips every day between Lyon-Saint-Exupéry airport and Grenoble.

By train from Paris (3h), Geneva (2h) and Lyon (1h20). Trains from Italy are currently disrupted, but you get a train + bus + train connection from Turin (4h), and Milan (5h), with a change in Chambéry.

By road:

- A41 - Chambéry (46 km), Annecy (100 km), Geneva (144 km)
- A48 - Lyon (105 km), Paris (566 km)
- A49 - Valence (99 km)

Transport in Grenoble

New in 2024, you can pay your ticket by directly tapping your credit card on the validation machines. These are *on the bus* for bus rides but *at the tram stop* for tram rides.

How to come?

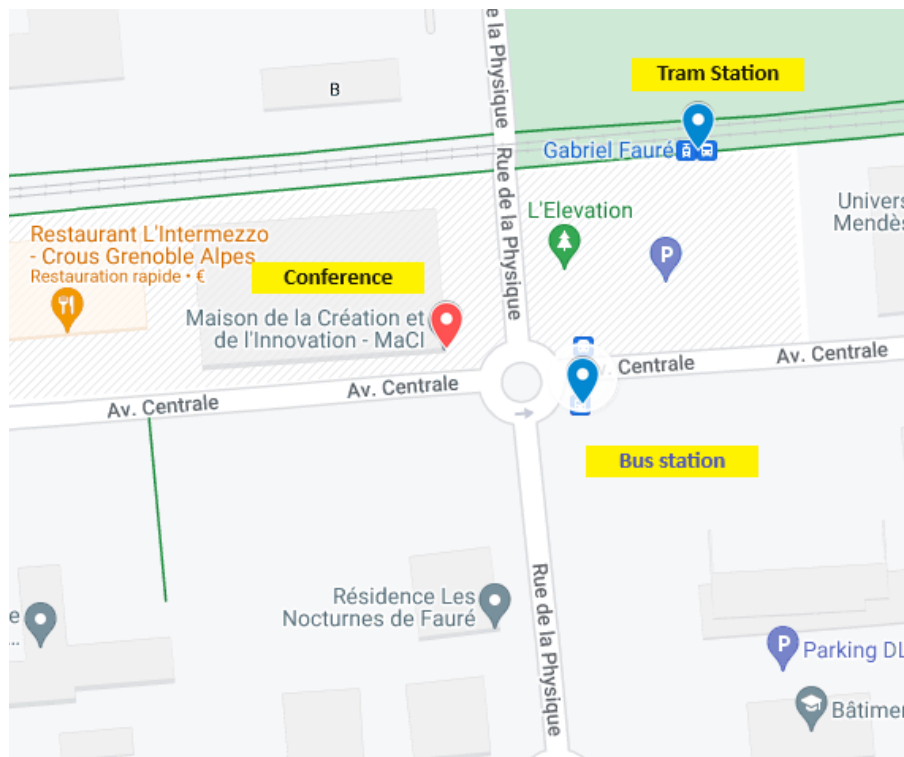
The "**Gabriel Fauré**" tram B and C stop is around 50 metres from the MaCI.

➔ **We recommend taking tram B, rather than tram C, as there is work during the conference, buses take over from trams**

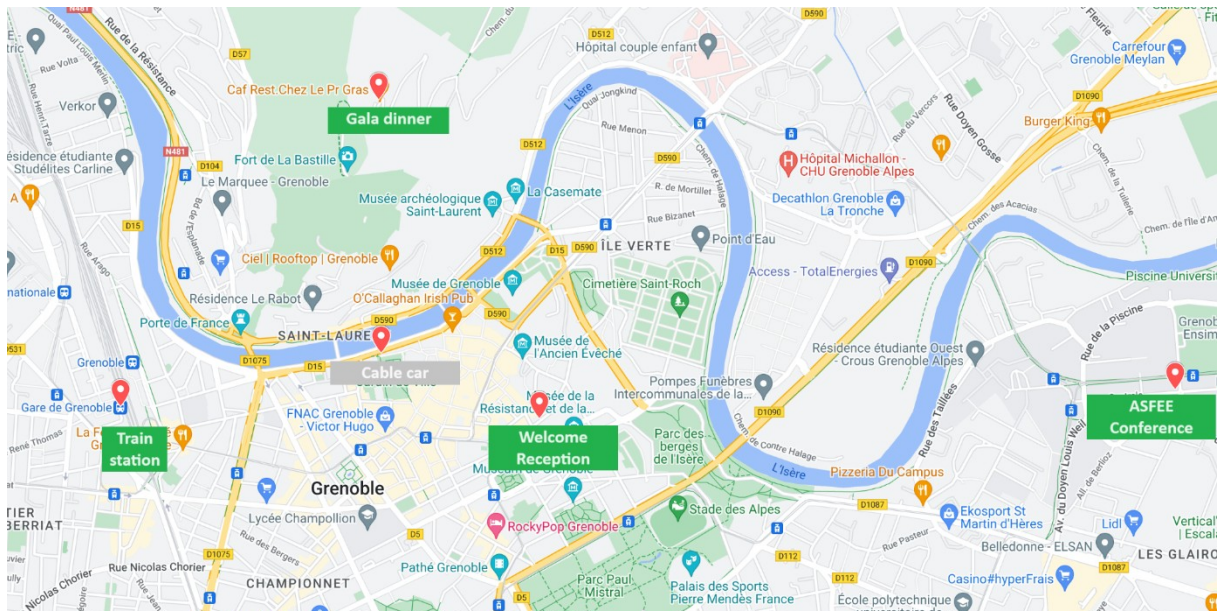
The site is served by two tramway lines:

Tram B: West to East campus via city center

Tram C: Following the perimeter of the center to Campus (note that in June, due to work, buses take over from trams). Tram to '**Flandrin Valmy**', then Bus to '**Gabriel Fauré**'

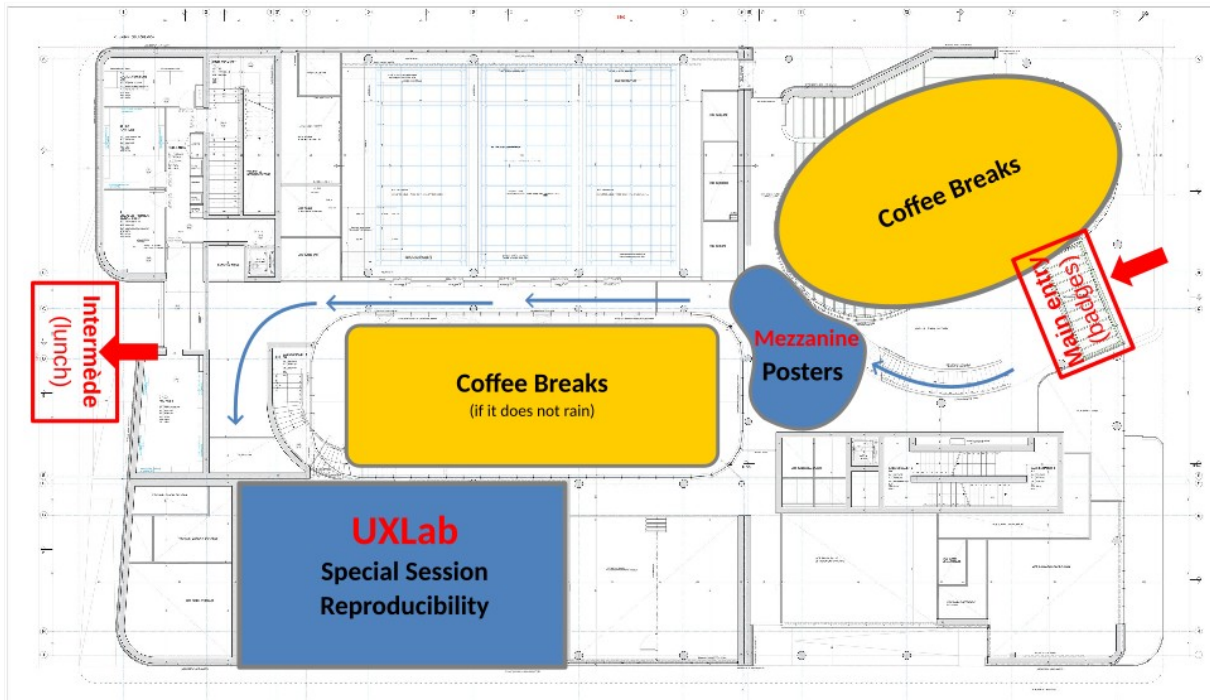


Registration desk

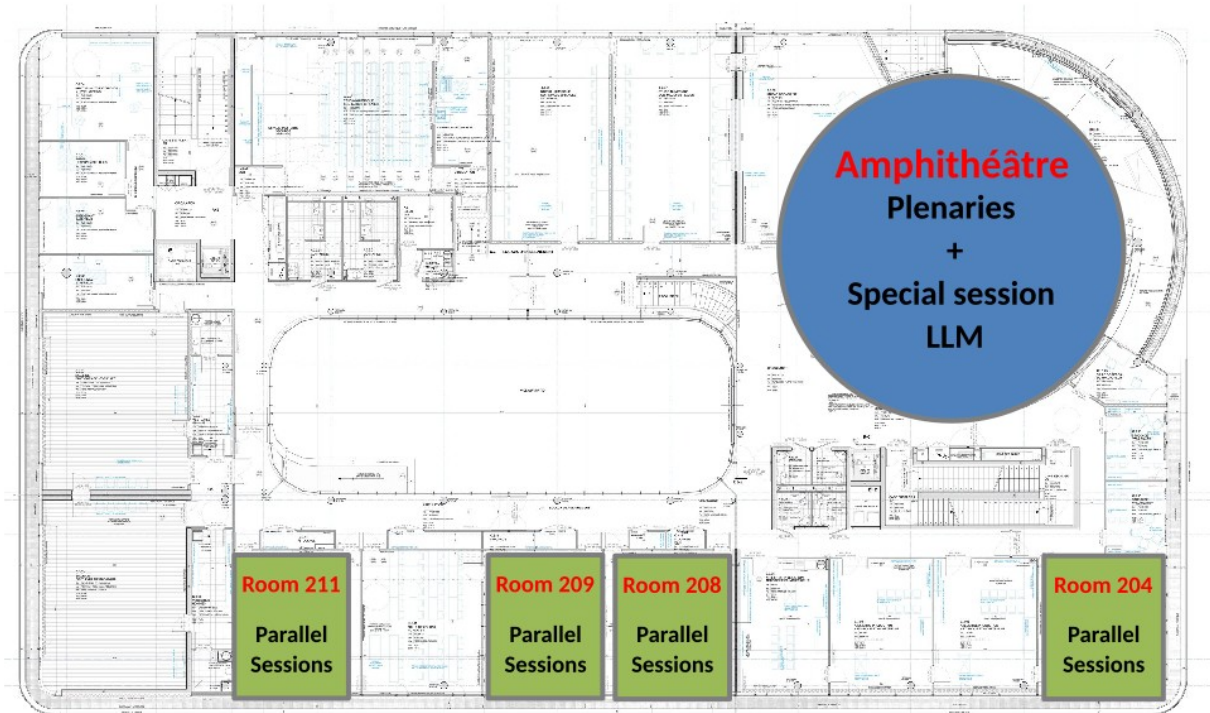
The registration desk will be in the **entrance hall** of the MaCI where you will collect your badge.

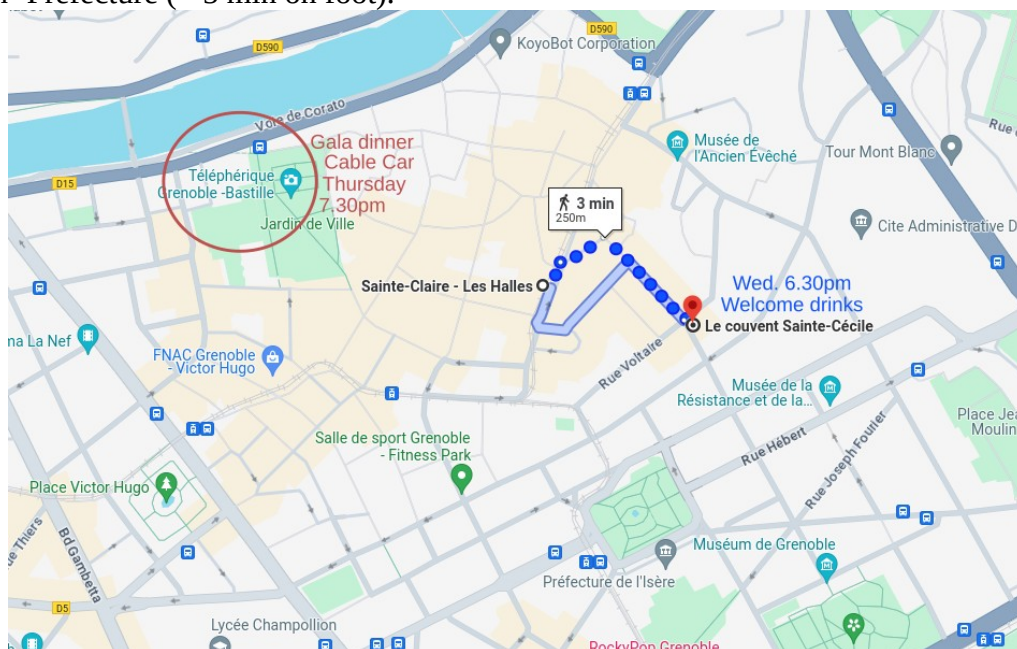

How to go there : Tram B, stop Sainte Claire, les Halles (+ 3 min on foot). Tram A, stop Verdun -Préfecture (+ 5 min on foot).

Gala dinner at **Per'Gras**, 90 chemin de la Bastille 38000 Grenoble

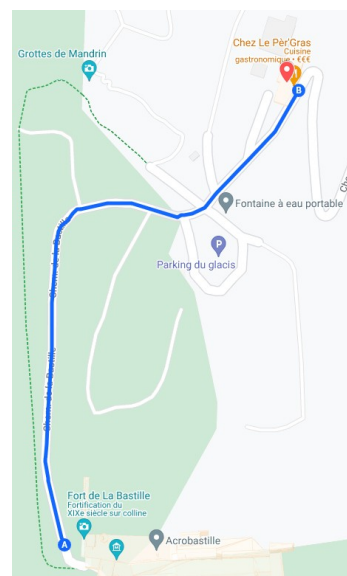
How to get there : meeting point at **19.30** at the Jardin de Ville Cable Car terminal (red on map). Round trip to the Bastille hill included in the conference fee for gala dinner participants. Last cable car back at **midnight**.

Also possible on foot : ~2km, +275m, ~45min, from the Fontaine du Lyon.

Once out of the cable car terminal on the hill, you will **have to walk 5 minutes** to the restaurant follow the mark 'Chez le Per'Gras.

Down the stairs, then towards the army museum, then out of the fort and on a paved street once you reach flat terrain again you see the restaurant in front of you

Visit Grenoble



La Bastille: This former military fort is the most popular tourist attraction in the Grenoble area. Built in the 19th century, it overlooks the city. Today, it hosts a diversified program. You can discover aerial courses, escape games, museums and restaurants. What's more, the site is classified as a Zone of Ecological Interest for its exceptional flora and fauna. Visitors looking for something to do in Grenoble won't want to miss the Bastille!

Grenoble Bastille cable car: Since 1934, this cable car has linked Grenoble to the summit of the Bastille, flying over the Saint-Laurent district. It's nicknamed "Les Bulles" because of the distinctive shape of its cabins. If you'd like to take the ride, you'll pay from five euros and sixty cents for a round-trip adult ticket. For children, it's four euros and sixty cents. Since July 2017, the cable car has been equipped with a webcam. It takes panoramic photos of the city at regular intervals. Visit the cable car's official website, and you might just see yourself, on the right, touring Grenoble!



Place Grenette: What else is there to do in Grenoble than stroll around Place Grenette? This has been the city's main square since the 17th century. Back then, it was home to a grain market and a cattle market. Today, Place Grenette is an ideal place to meet and stroll around, with its cafés and stores. What's more, you'll be able to admire an imposing Sassenage stone fountain. Named Le Château d'Eau Lavalette, it was built in 1825. As you approach, you'll see four cherubs riding dolphins.

The Saint-Laurent footbridge: The Saint-Laurent footbridge spans the Isère, linking Quai Mounier to Quai Jongkind. It was built in 1837, then modernized in 1909. It stands on the site of the city's first bridge, built as early as the 11th century. This essential passageway has suffered a great deal of damage over the years. Indeed, the Isère floods have frequently destroyed it. If you're looking for something to do in Grenoble, this emblem of the city is a must!





Grenoble Museum: If you're looking for something to do in Grenoble when it rains, don't hesitate to visit the city's museum. Opened in 1798, it houses over nine hundred works of art. Its collection of Western paintings is particularly impressive. From the 13th to the 21st century, you can admire paintings by Flemish, Spanish and Dutch masters. The museum also boasts a collection of Egyptian antiquities, brought back by Champollion. The Musée de Grenoble is open every day except Tuesdays and certain public holidays. You can visit between 10 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. Tickets for adults cost eight euros, while those under eighteen are free!

Where to eat in Grenoble

There are many restaurants clustered in the pedestrian city centre or in the Championnet neighbourhood south-west of Place Victor Hugo.

Regional specialities are mostly heavy winter dishes ; but if you like melted cheese and do want to have a proper regional meal, then head to :

- La fondue - They have a multitude of fondues and specialties from our mountains. 5 Rue Brocherie, 38000 Grenoble
- La ferme à Dédé - If you're looking for local dishes in a mountain setting, this is the place. 55 Avenue Alsace Lorraine, 38000 Grenoble
- Le Gratin dauphinois - Another restaurant on my must-try list, where you can enjoy ravioli gratins, salads and other more classic dishes. 52 Avenue Félix Viallet, 38000 Grenoble
